## 2025 SCHEDULE

### **CLASS 1 : CO-OPERATIVE**

#### ***Adventureland***

*"For true life adventure ride the JUNGLE RIVER."*

Only one entry per WI

### **Jungle River Ride**

A combined exhibit to depict the title in the context of the overall schedule theme

Entries must include:

**An exhibit of fresh flowers and natural plant material**

**An item of cookery, to be judged on taste and appearance, no fish, meat or cream.**

**An item of craft**

Other items are allowed within the exhibit for decoration

All elements of the display are to be within a 2' x 2' x 2' (61.5cm x 61.5cm x 61.5cm) space. There must be a baseboard and self-supporting backboard each 2' x 2' (61.5cm x 61.5cm).

Items for judging must be identified in writing when the display is set up. A label for display after judging has taken place may be left with the exhibit but the text and WI name must be hidden from view for judging but easily made visible afterwards.

Displays will be judged from the front (viewed from both eye level and a standing position).

Floral exhibit to be brought to the marquee ready for display.

No more than two members per WI to stage the exhibit in the marquee between  
**9.00am and 11.30am on Tuesday 17th June 2025**

**One entry per WI**

ENTRY FEE - £10

PRIZES: 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

## CLASS 2 : COOKERY

### ***Mad Hatter's Tea Party: The Dormouse's Story***

*"Once upon a time there were three little sisters and their names were Elsie, Lacie, and Tillie; and they lived at the bottom of a well—"*

*"What did they live on?" said Alice,. "They lived on treacle," said the Dormouse, after thinking a minute or two. Alice repeated her question. "Why did they live at the bottom of a well?"*

*The Dormouse took a minute to think about it, then said, "It was a treacle-well. And so these three little sisters—they were learning to draw, you know—"*

*"What did they draw?" said Alice. "Treacle," said the Dormouse*

To be judged on appearance and taste

### CLASS 3 : EMBROIDERY

#### ***Dumbo the Elephant***

*I seen a peanut stand, and heard a rubber band! I seen a needle that winked its eye! But I be done seen about everything when I see a elephant fly!*

Only one entry per member

#### **Dumbo the Elephant**

A hand embroidered depiction of Dumbo the Elephant of your own design. No kits to be used.

Entries should be stretched over a flat, rigid substrate and be mounted but unframed.

Overall dimensions (incl. mount) not to exceed 30 x 38 cm (12" x 15").

Entry Fee £5

***PRIZES (from Myrtle Harris bursary): 1<sup>st</sup> Prize £100 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize £50, 3<sup>rd</sup> Prize £33***

***Myrtle Harris Salver will be awarded to the highest placed Lincs South member in this class***

## **CLASS 4 : COLLAGE**

### ***Peter Pan***

*"There it is, Wendy! Second star to the right and straight on 'til morning."*

Only one entry per member

### **Peter Pan's Flight**

A collage of any materials backed with a rigid material for display

Overall Dimensions not to exceed A3 size 29.7 x 42 cm (11.7 x 16.5 inches)

Entry Fee £5

PRIZES 1<sup>st</sup> £15, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5

***The Caythorpe Salver will be awarded to the highest placed Lincs South member in this class***

## **CLASS 5 : NOVICE CLASS**

### ***Steamboat Willie***

*"Hope you don't feel hurt big boy" "Help! Help! Man Overboard!" said the parrot*

Only one entry per member

### **Steamboat Willie**

A poster reflecting an element of the Steamboat Willie film, hand drawn or hand painted and backed with a rigid material for display

Not to exceed 10" (25.4 cm) in any direction.

Entry Fee £5

PRIZES 1<sup>st</sup> £15, 2<sup>nd</sup> £10, 3<sup>rd</sup> £5

***The Novice Cup will be awarded to the highest placed Lincs South member in this class***

## Recipe for use in Class 2 - Cookery

### The Dormouse's Treacle Tart

#### For the pastry

250g/9oz [plain flour](#)  
130g/4½oz [butter](#), plus extra for greasing

#### For the filling

400g/14oz golden syrup  
150g/5½oz fine fresh white breadcrumbs  
1 lemon, zest and juice  
1 egg, beaten, for egg wash

#### Method

1. To make the pastry, rub the butter into the flour until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add cold water and mix to a firm dough.
2. Preheat the oven to 200°C/180C Fan/Gas 6 and put a heavy baking tray in the oven to heat up. Grease a deep 18cm/7" in loose-bottomed fluted flan tin with butter.
3. Remove about 150g/5½oz of pastry from the main ball and set aside for the lattice top.
4. Roll out the rest of the pastry and line the prepared flan tin with the pastry.
5. Prick the base with a fork, to stop the base rising up during baking.
6. Place the reserved pastry for the lattice top on cling film and roll out thinly. Egg wash the pastry and set aside to chill in the fridge (the cling film makes it easier to move about).
7. **To make the filling**, heat the syrup gently in a large pan but do not boil.
8. Once melted, add the breadcrumbs, lemon juice and zest to the syrup. Pour the syrup mixture into the lined tin and level the surface.
9. Remove the reserved pastry from the fridge and cut into long strips, 1cm/½in wide.
10. Egg wash the edge of the pastry in the tin, and create a lattice pattern over the mixture
11. Bake on the pre-heated baking tray in the hot oven for about 10 minutes until the pastry has started to colour, and then reduce the oven temperature to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4.
12. Bake for a further 25-30 minutes until the pastry is golden-brown and the filling set. Remove the tart from the oven and leave to firm up in the tin. Serve warm or cold.

# RULES

1. All exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor, have been completed within the last 2 years, and not entered in any previous WI competition
2. All exhibits will be judged within the guidelines laid down in the extant NFWI Handbook "**On with the Show**". This can be viewed online at: <https://mywi.thewi.org.uk/interests/shows-and-competitions/on-with-the-show> or at your Federation office.
3. The judge's decision is final. No correspondence will be entered into. Judges may, entirely at their discretion, give written comments.
4. All entries to be brought to the WI Marquee between 9am and 11.30am on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June.
5. NO cars are to be left outside the marquee after unloading on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> June. Please pay attention to the Parking Steward.
6. Maximum of two people to stage Class 1.
7. All entries must be brought with a label attached identifying the exhibitor and their WI but there must be nothing included in any exhibit which could identify the exhibitor. On the day an entry number will be allocated to each entry and a card showing this number will be placed face up next to the entry. The card showing the entrant's name and WI will be placed face down underneath or beside the entry. The latter will be turned face up after judging.
8. The glass South Lincs Trophy will be awarded to the exhibit in Class 1 receiving the most votes from visitors to the marquee.
9. The rules of the Lincolnshire Agricultural Society must be strictly adhered to (see online at [www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk](http://www.lincolnshireshow.co.uk) )
10. You may not dismantle your exhibit before 6.00pm on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2025.
11. Exhibits must be collected from the WI marquee on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June between 6.00pm and 7.00pm. Exhibits will be left unattended after 7.00pm and disposed of the following day.
12. Cars are allowed on the Showground on Thursday evening at the discretion of the Lincolnshire Show Society.
13. Every care will be taken to protect the exhibits but no liability is accepted for any loss or damage.

# LINCOLNSHIRE SHOW 2025 HINTS & TIPS

## ALL CLASSES

Be sure to read the instructions and size limits carefully. These will be strictly adhered to in the judging and if your entry does not comply it will be disqualified.

### **Class 1 – Collaborative – The Jungle Cruise Ride**

Ensure you include a card specifying the items to be judged to avoid any confusion. This applies particularly if there is more than one item of craft/cookery on display.

You must also provide a label to identify your entry but ensure that this is either attached in such a way as to not be visible when the entry is displayed or can be removed/turned over to ensure anonymity during judging.

When planning and executing your entry, bear in mind the possible effects of heat, humidity or damp on the appearance of your exhibit (e.g. flowers wilting, icing or other decoration melting, etc). Your exhibit should be able to withstand conditions within the marquee for the duration of the Show, without need for attention.

Check “On With The Show” (2021 Edition) to understand the difference between a floral “exhibit” and an “arrangement”. You will see that an exhibit gives you greater opportunity for creativity. Natural plant material is any vegetable matter. This includes fresh, dried, garden, wild, foliage, fruit, vegetables and seaweed.

### **Class 2 – Cookery – Mad Tea Party : The Dormouse’s Treacle Well Story**

Your Treacle Tart must be made and decorated to the supplied recipe only and be presented on a flat base i.e. cake board or foil covered cardboard or flat platter.

### **Class 3 – Craft – Embroidery – Dumbo the Elephant**

Entries must be hand embroidered and not from a kit. They can depict any element of the 1941 film.

### **Class 4 – Collage – Peter Pan’s Flight**

You may use any medium but it must be adhered to a backing that is firm enough to be self-supporting once mounted. Entries may depict any element of the 1953 film Peter Pan.

### **Class 5 – Novice, Craft – Steamboat Willie**

This class is open to any member who has not previously entered any item into this or previous WI competitions at the Lincolnshire Show. Entries should reflect an element of the 1928 film Steamboat Willie and should therefore be in shades of black and white.

Each entry in classes 2, 3, 4, and 5 must be the work of **ONE** individual member.
